

Homeric Warrior

1. Homeric warrior takes pride in his prowess as a fighter/killer as well as his ability to reason.

Two components that make up the disposition/temperament of a warrior:

I. Thumos = location is beneath the warrior's breastplate, heart. Thumos is what inspires the warrior to take great risks, even at the cost of his life.

II. Nous = location is the mind, governs the warrior's ability to reason.

All of the actions of a warrior are targeted at fulfilling the warrior's code of honor = bravery AND intelligence

As a result of his actions, unquestionably, he will achieve "timé" = honor
